From September 2023 all primary school pupils will be offered free school meals for the academic year thanks to investment by the Mayor of London. This year, too, the Council has established a Free School Meals task force, aimed at providing a hot, healthy meal to as many children in poverty as possible in the long-term.

Even though free meals are coming from September it is still really important you register for free meals (if you are eligible) as this will allow your school to claim important extra funding

that will benefit your child. Schools get extra funding, known as the 'Pupil Premium', for every child registered as eligible for a free school meal if their parents are receiving benefits.
